Creating Excellence is aspiring to its name and wants to celebrate ongoing activity or projects where people have achieved excellent work or created results that are outstanding at helping communities in the region.

To do this we are launching REWARDS 2007. We want this awards programme to illustrate that people are at the heart of all successes and the main reward will be a study tour to the value of £3,000 for the winners and their organisation.

There will be two 'highly commended' REWARDS of £500 to spend on learning activities or learning consultancy. The REWARDS are open to the public, private and voluntary and community sectors.

The closing date is 16th October and the REWARDS presentation dinner will be on 5th December 2007.

Nomination is short and straightforward - we want as many people as possible to make suggestions. All three short-listed applications may feature on our web site and the overall winner will be featured as a full case study.

The South West region is large and diverse. It contains many prosperous areas but also has pockets of extreme deprivation and challenging targets for growth. Let's reward and celebrate the work of people across the region who are improving communities with diverse approaches to funding, development and learning and who have the spirit to keep going until they achieve the best results.
